While there is no Counter Terrorist Unit in real life, the United States Department of Defense created the Counterintelligence Field Activity Agency in 2002, designed to investigate and repel terrorism within the United States and its interests. Army Counterintelligence Agent (MOS 35L) is responsible for detecting and countering foreign intelligence entities. These specialized soldiers complete investigations, collect evidence and help stop international terrorist threats.

### Army Counterintelligence Agent (MOS 35L): Career Details

In 2017, the SCLCT arrested 250 terrorist suspects on charges that included planning acts of terrorism, association with a terrorist organization, recruitment, and terrorist financing. Courts tried or dismissed approximately 550 terrorism cases. Approximately 1,100 terrorism suspects remained in detention awaiting trial at year's end.
